# Boundaries have changed - know where you fit!

As we head into election season its important to know how the electoral boundary changes affect you and your vote. The City of Regina is required to review its ward boundaries after every three elections or when the population of a ward changes. This is somewhat the same principal for provincial boundaries. Boundary reviews are necessary to determine any changes to population as fluctuations of +/-10% impacts the balance in the various areas. Reviewing boundaries ensures that every eligible vote has equitable representation by city councillors and provincial representatives alike.

So how have things changed for the 2024/25 upcoming elections? In some cases, a lot. It is good to understand how the boundaries have moved and how they may impact your voting location as well as possible changes to candidates knocking on your door. Here is what it looks like:

City of Regina Ward 8 Boundaries - The Ward will be losing the Normanview and Normanview West communities, and North Central community will be joining the Ward. No changes that impact Rosemont or Mount Royal.

Provincial Boundaries - The biggest impact is the split of the Rosemont community. If you live on the east side of Campbell Street you are now in the Regina Elphinstone-Centre area. If you live on the west side of Campbell Street you remain in the Regina Mount Royal area.

For further clarity, please check the www.Regina.ca for ward changes or www.elections.sk.ca for provincial boundary changes, or call your local City Councillor or MLA.

Elections are important - be sure your vote is counted!
